

OVERVIEW

The Beechcraft King Air is an iconic aircraft design, going all the way back to its first production model, the Queen Air, in 1969. The King Air C90 is a 7 passenger variant.

The E90 variant can best be thought of as "Extra!" With Pratt & Whitney PT6A-28 engines, you get more power and performance than then ubiquitous C90. The E90 has a 350 lb cargo capacity in the baggage compartment and circular passenger windows.

With seating for 7, passengers can relax and enjoy the flight in a comfortable cabin. An aft baggage compartment adds flexibility for moving passengers and their cargo in comfort.

N690G features upgraded avionics, including a Garmin GNS530W for operations in IMC and a 3-screen passenger entertainment system in the cabin. With fresh hot section inspections on both engines, and props just a few hundred hours out of overhaul, it's ready to enter service and take you on your next adventure.

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
